## Household Survival Budget sources


- Housing: HUD's Fair Market Rent (40th percentile) Efficiency studio rate for single adult, 2 bedroom for family, includes utilities (excluding phone)
- Child Care: Represents cost of registered home-based child-care
- Food: Thrifty Level (lowest of four levels) of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Food Plans with regional variation
- Transportation: Car expenses include gas and motor oil and other vehicle maintenance expenses from BLS— Consumer Expenditure Survey (CES)
- Health Care: Out-of-pocket health care spending for insurance, medical services, prescription drugs, and medical supplies based on region and household income from Consumer Expenditure Survey (CES)
- Technology: Basic smartphone plan using Consumer Reports "Best Low-Cost Cell-Phone Plans"
- Taxes: Includes federal and state taxes where applicable, as well as SSI and Medicare taxes from IRS Form 1040
- Miscellaneous: 10 percent of the total (including taxes) to cover cost overruns





## How does Tennessee compare?

- In 2017, Tennessee had the 12<sup>th</sup> highest percentage of households with income below the ALICE Threshold compared to other states
- New Mexico had the highest with 49 percent
- North Dakota had the lowest with 32 percent



#### Household Income, Tennessee, 2017





#### Households by Income, 2010 to 2017




#### Household Types by Income, 2017

## **Cost to live in Tennessee**

#### **Household Survival Budget, 2017**

FPL = \$12,060 single adult and \$24,600 family

TN minimum wage **2017**: \$7.25/hour = \$14,500/year

**Basic costs increased** 

from 2007 to 2017: 23% for a single adult, 31% for a family of four – compared to 22% inflation

## **Cost to live in Sumner County**

## What does it cost to afford the basic necessities?

The Household Survival Budget gives the cost of housing, child care, food, transportation, and health care at a bare-minimum "survival" level. It does not include any savings, leaving households without a cushion for unexpected expenses and unable to invest in the future. Yet even this minimal budget was much higher than the adjusted Federal Poverty Level of \$12,060 for a single adult and \$24,600 for a family of four in 2017.

## **ALICE Discussion Points**

- You can't fix what you can't measure.
- ALICE doesn't overlook the population living in poverty, it simply expands our understanding of who is really struggling financially.
- Policies to address poverty strive to raise those below the poverty line to just above it, after which 40% find themselves back below the poverty line within five years.
- A lot of data, but ALICE is actually about people. All of us suffer when the ALICE segment of our population suffers.
